 day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and thirty; and Amulatto boy named James
 aged about nine years sold free on the twenty fifth
 day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and thirty two; and I do hereby declare
 the aforesaid slaves to be free in manner and discharged
 from all manner of servitude or service, to me my
 heirs Executors and administrators at the respective
 periods of time therein before mentioned according to
 the purport true intent and meaning thereof and the
 act of assembly in such case made and provided
 In Testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed
 my name and affixed my seal this fifteenth day of
 May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and thirty.

 case made and provided
