

To all to whom it may concern Be it known, That I Mary Callahan of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and Considerations me & heirs to moving have released from Slavery & liberated manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby release from Slavery & liberate manumitted and set free, from and after the day of my death my mulatto woman named Adele aged about twenty one years: and I the said Mary Callahan do declare the said mulatto woman named Adele to be free manumitted and discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me my heirs Executors and administrators from and after the day of my death as aforesaid In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty.

and the back of the aforesaid deed was thus written to wit: Anne Arundel County said: On this twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty personally appeared Mary Callahan party to the within instrument appearing before me the undersigned a Justice of the Peace for the County aforesaid and acknowledged she came to her act and deed for the purposes therein mentioned and the mulatto woman within named to be manumitted according to the said within mentioned and to be free and manumitted from her or any claiming under the said therein mentioned and the act of Assembly in such case made and provided
