

Maryland' town: This Indenture Wm. Wells
and I Polly Marr of Anne Arundel in the State of
Maryland' aforesaid' for and in consideration of the
sum of One and ten' in hand paid before the
making and delivery of these presents the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged have released from
slavery my son Edward Marr (bought by me
from certain John Pitts of Frederick County as
will appear by receipts in my possession) and
manumitted and him set free and do by these
presents release from slavery the said Edward
Marr (a coloured' man) and under the age of
fifty five of a constitution sound in sense mind
and body and capable by labour to provide to
himself sufficient food and raiment and other
necessaries of life In Testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
first of June 1821.

On the back of the aforesaid indenture was thus
written to wit: Maryland, Anne Arundel County
June 1st 1821. Then came Polly Marr before me
a Justice of the peace in and for the County aforesaid
and acknowledged the above instrument signifying
that he did and does and the above named
Edward Marr take free according to the true
meaning and intention of the same
