To all whom it may Concern Be it known that I James Williams for divers good causes and considerations in the month of moving as also in further consideration of said act and inasmuch as I have since had released from slavery a white manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby release from slavery a white manumitted and set free my negro woman named Anne being between forty and forty five years of age, and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and that the said negro woman named Anne I do declare to be henceforth free manumitted and discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me my Executors or administrators forever. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty third day of June eighteen hundred and twenty one.
