

To all whom these presents may come I do
 know that I John Bonner of Baltimore in the
 State of Maryland for divers good causes & considerations
 me therunto moving have by these presents released
 from slavery / liberated manumitted and set free
 by these presents do hereby release from slavery
 liberate manumit & set free my negro woman
 nelly aged about thirty years and her increase
 from and after the date of these presents & I do
 declare the said negro & her increase to be henceforth
 free manumitted & discharged from all manner
 of servitude or service to me my Executors or
 administrators forever. In Testimony whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand & seal this ninth
 day of June Eighteen hundred & twenty one
 Signed Sealed & delivered

and the back of the aforesaid deed reads thus
 attested to wit: Anne and Alice Bonny land: and
 this ninth day of June Eighteen hundred and twenty
 one personally appears John Bonner party to the
 within instrument of writing before me the
 subscribed a Justice of the peace of the State of
 Maryland for the County aforesaid and
 acknowledges the same to be his act and deed
 for the purposes within mentioned and the negro
 woman and her increase within named to be
 henceforth manumitted and discharged from
 all services to him or to any claiming under him
 and to be free and manumitted according to the act
 of assembly in such cases made and provided
 as acknowledged before Robert Melch
