To all whom it may Concern here Knows that I
William Brewer of the City of Annapolis in the State of
Maryland for aivers good Causes and Considerations
and therunto moving as also in further Consideration
of one dollar current money to me in hand paid have
released from Slavery liberated manumitted and set
free: and by these presents do hereby release from Slavery
liberate manumitt and set free my negro woman
one named Jane Gant. being of the age of forty three
years. the other named Polly Gibson being of the
age of thirty three years and able to work and gain
a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and them
the said negro women named Jane Gant and Polly
Gibson. I do declare to be henceforth free manumitted
and discharged from all manner of servitudes or service
to me my Executors or administrators forever On
Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my Seal this seventh day of April in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four
