To all whom it may concern Be it known that I  
 Margaret Shiles of the City of Annapolis in Anne Arundel  
 County and State of Maryland for divers good Causes and  
 Considerations thereinunto moving as also in further  
 Consideration of one dollar current money to me in hand  
 paid have released from slavery liberated manumitted  
 and set free and by these presents do hereby release from  
 slavery manumitted and set free from and after the periods  
 hereinafter mentioned my negro man named Davy  
 my negro woman Fanny and my negro Girl Mary  
 that is to say the said negro man Davy being now about  
 the age of forty years to be free from and after the first  
 day of June in the year eighteen hundred and twenty seven  
 the said negro woman Fanny being now about the  
 age of twenty seven years to be free from and after the  
 first day of June in the year Eighteen hundred and  
 thirty two and the said negro Girl Mary being now  
 about twenty four years of age to be free from and  
 after the first day of June in the year eighteen hundred  
 and thirty nine the said negroes Davy Fanny  
 and Mary being each able to work and gain a  
 sufficient
