

At the foot of the aforesaid deed was thus written to wit

same to be her act and deed for the purposes above men-
tioned and the above negroes to be free according to
the purport of the above instrument of writing

Walter Croft of the City of Annapolis in the State of
Maryland for divers good Causes and Considerations me
thereunto moving as also on further Consideration of the
sum of five dollars current money to me in hand paid
the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge by these presents
do hereby release from slavery manumit and set free
the following negro slaves when they shall have arrived
at the respective ages hereinafter mentioned to wit Negro
Henry Adarson born the twenty fourth of October one
thousand eight hundred and twenty two to be free when
