To all whom it may concern be it known that I
William Shipley of Robert of Ann Arundel County in the
State of Maryland for diverse good causes and considerations
me therunto moving as also in further Consideration of one
dollar Current money to me in hand paid have released
from slavery liberated manumitted and set free and
by these presents do hereby release from slavery liberate
manumitted and set free my negro woman named
Rachel Baker being of the age of forty three years old
and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and
maintenance and then the said negro woman named
Rachel Baker I do declare to be hereforth free
manumitted and discharged from all manner of
servitude or service to me my executor or administrators
forever In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and affixed my seal this tenth day of
(April)
