Joseph R Hopkins of the City of Philadelphia have  
manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby  
manumit and set free my negro woman Sarah Harrison  
aged fully two years and her daughter Bet aged about  
twenty years they being residents of Anne Arundel  
County acquired to me by my intermarriage with Anne  
Maria Snowden. I do hereby declare them to be henceforth  
free manumitted and discharged from all manner of  
servitude or service to me my executors or administrators  
forever In testimony whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand & affixed my seal this twenty fourth
