I know all men by these presents that I Charles
Phillips of Anne Arundel County for divers good causes &
considerations (one whereunto moving) & in further
consideration of five dollars to me paid have released
from slavery (if slavery they are in) manumitted &
set free and by these presents do manumit and set
free (as far as I have any claim on them) the following
negroes who are my children. To-wit Margaret Phillips
Charles Phillips. William Phillips. Hannah Phillips
David Phillips. Julian Phillips. Harriet Phillips
and Hannah Phillips. and I do declare the said
negroes so far as I have any interest in them. to be from
this time forever hereafter together with their issue
free quit and discharged from me & my heirs. In
testimony whereof I hereto set my hand and affix
my seal this eleventh day of October eighteen hundred
and twenty six
