To all whom it may concern be it known that I Sophia Moore of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes and Considerations me therunto moving as also in further Consideration of one dollar current money to me in hand paid have released from slavery liberated manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate manumit and set free my two negro Girls Viz Mary aged about thirteen years of age and Lanny aged about eleven years of age able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and they the said negro Girls named Mary and Lanny and their increase to be free to their later generations I do declare to be henceforth free manumitted and discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me my Executors or administrators forever. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the twenty fourth day of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty eight.
