


day of December of the year eighteen hundred and thirty
nine, free manumitted and discharged, from all manner
of servitude, or service to me my executors or administrators,
or assigns, forever. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty third
day of December in the year eighteen hundred and
thirty eight.

At the foot of the foregoing was thus written, Court
Ann Arundel County So. On this 23rd day of Dec^r
1838 personally appeared Samuel Norman party to the
above instrument of writing before the subscriber a
Justice of the peace for said County and acknowledges
the same to be his act and deed for the purposes
therein mentioned, and the negro man therein named
to be free from and after the twenty third day of Dec^r
eighteen hundred and thirty nine, according to the act
of assembly in such cases made.
