

Recorded the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of November 1829

To all whom it may concern, be it known, that I Ann Boone of Anne Arundel County, in the State of Maryland, for diverse good causes and considerations me thereunto moving, as also in further consideration of Five dollars current money to me in hand paid, have released from Slavery, Liberated, Manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from Slavery, liberate, manumit and set free my negro woman Kitty Gooden, being of the age of thirty eight years and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and her true said negro woman named Kitty Gooden, I do declare to be henceforth free manumitted and discharged, from all manner of servitude or service to me, my executors or administrators forever.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal this twenty fourth day of December in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty nine.
