To all whom it may concern Be it known that I Charlotte Hutton of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations me therunto moving as also in further consideration of the sum of one dollar current money to me in hand paid I have released from slavery liberated manumitted and set free and leg these presents do hereby release from slavery liberate manumit and set free my negro man named Killen being of the age of twenty seven years and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and him the said negro man named Killen I do declare to be henceforth free manumitted and discharged from all manner of service to me my executors or administrators after the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six forever to be free. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twentieth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty.
