

At the foot of the aforesaid was thus written, to wit.
Maryland, Anne Arundel County, Jct.

On this 26th day of November 1830 personally
appeared Semina Duwall party to the above instrument
of writing before me the subscriber a justice of the peace
for the County aforesaid and acknowledged the same
to be her act and deed for the purpose therein mentioned
and the negroes above named at the respective periods
of time above specified to be manumitted and discharged
from all manner of service to her or to any claiming under
her and to be free and manumitted according to the act
of assembly in such case made and provided.

To all whom it may concern be it known that I
William S. Goldborough of Anne Arundel County in the
State of Maryland for divers good causes and
considerations mo^t thereunto moving as also in further
consideration of Three Dollars current money to me in
hand paid have released from slavery liberated
manumitted and set free and by these presents do
hereby release from slavery liberate manumit and
set free my negro Girl named Henry Lenby being of
the age of fifteen years and able to work and gain
a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and her the
said negro Girl named Henry Lenby, I do declare from
and after the thirteenth day of January eighteen
hundred and forty one, to be free manumitted and
discharged from all manner of servitude to me my
Executors or administrators for ever In Testimony
