To all whom it may concern Be it known that I
William P. Hensley of Anne Arundel County and State
of Maryland for divers good causes and consideration
me therunto moved as also in further consideration
of the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars
current money to me in hand paid have released
from Slavery liberated manumitted and set free
and by these presents do hereby release from Slavery
liberate manumit and set free after serving until
they are thirty years of age one negro Girl by the
name of Elizer aged ~~two~~ years and nine months
and one negro Girl by the name of Aray aged one
year and six months each child the children of my
Slave Minty Hall by name each of these children
and their offspring are to be free at the age of thirty
years these children being sound and appear fair
to be able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood
and maintenance and the above said named
children I declare to be here forth after the expiration
of said term of thirty years to be free and discharge
from all manner of servitude or service to me my
Executors or administrators for ever In Testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this 24th day of September and in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and.
