To all whom it may concern, be it known that I Susanna Barber of the City of Annapolis in the State of Maryland for divers good causes me therunto moving and also in further consideration of the sum of five dollars to me in hand paid have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby release from slavery manumit and set free my mulatto child the daughter of my mulatto woman Eliza the child named Martha Ann aged about two years and four months, and her the said Mulatto child named Martha Ann I do declare to be henceforth free manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitude to me my executors or administrators forever. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 31 day of May 1831.
