To all whom it may concern be it known that I John Sellman of Ann Arundel County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving as also in further consideration of one dollar current money to me in hand paid, do manumit the following named negroes to be free as hereinafter expressed to wit, my negro man named Henry to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty seven, William to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and forty two, Jack to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and forty eight, Ned to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and fifty two, my negro woman named Delia to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and forty and all her increase born after the execution of this deed to be free at the age of thirty years, my negro boy Louis to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and fifty five, my negro girl Betty to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and fifty seven and all her increase to be free at the age of thirty years, my negro boy Harry to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and
