

release from slavery, manumit and set free, my negro man named Charles, sometimes called Charles Butler, being under forty five years of age, of a healthy constitution, sound in mind and body, and capable by labour to procure to him sufficient food and raiment, with other requisite necessities of life. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth day of March in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty two.

To all whom it may concern, Be it known that I George Scott of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland for divers, good causes and Considerations, me thereto moving, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free, my coloured man named Philip Buckingham, being now of the age of thirty two years, of dark mulatto complexion, having a small scar under his right eye, and a scar on his left wrist, five feet five inches in height, and now, to able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance
