 years to be free from and after the first day of September
 which will be in the year eighteen hundred and forty
 three and the issue of the said Hester if any be born
 during her ~~her~~ time of servitude shall be and hereby
 are declared free as they shall severly and respectively
 arrive at the age of thirty years hereby declaring the
 said negro Hester manumitted and discharged from
 slavery from and after the the said first day of
 September in the year eighteen hundred and forty
 three and her issue if any to be free as aforesaid, from
 me and from all person or persons claiming under me.

 this the 29th day of May in the year eighteen hundred
 and thirty two.
