To all whom it may concern, be it known that We Adam Miller, John Miller and James Hunter of the city of Annapolis in the State of Maryland and Williams Parsons of George Town District of Columbia for divers good causes and considerations us thereunto moving as also in further consideration of five dollars current money to us in hand paid, have released from slavery liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free our negro woman named Mary being of the age of thirty two years, and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and her the said negro woman named Mary we do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of servitude or service to us our Executors or administrators for ever. In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals this Seventeenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two.
