State of Maryland, Ann Arundel County, to wit:
To all whom it may concern, be it known, that I Nicholas Macculbin of Ann Arundel County and State of Maryland as aforesaid for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving, as also in further consideration of five dollars current money to me in hand paid, have released from slavery liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free my negro girl named Mant being of the age of thirteen years, and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and her the said negro girl named Mant I do declare to be free, manumitted and discharged from and after the twenty fourth of December

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
