To all whom it may concern be it known that I Ann Franklin, of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free my mulatto woman named Sophy Tydings being of the age of forty three years and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and for the said mulatto woman named Sophy Tydings I do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me my Executors or administrators forever. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.
