To all whom it may concern, be it known that I Amos Clark of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations me therunto moving as also in further consideration of five dollars current money to me in hand paid have released from Slavery, liberated, Manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby; release from slavery, liberate, Manumit and set free my negro Man named Reuben being of the age of twenty six years and my Mulatto Man named Peter being of the age of twenty four years and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and them the said Negro and Mulatto Men named Reuben and Peter I do declare to be henceforth free, Manumitted and discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me my executors or administrators forever. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.
