

I have this day sold to George Watts as well more
fully appears by a bill of sale executed to him on
this day and her the said Sary and her increase
I do declare to be free manumitted and discharged
from all manner of servitude or service to me my
Executors or administrators or any one claiming under
me for ever past and after this and each of their
line of service as aforesaid mentioned and intended by
me And Testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this fourth day of January 1818.

On the back of the aforesaid deed was thus written
to wit: Anne Ansted County to wit: On this 14th of
January 1818. personally appeared Stephen Boone
party to the within instrument appearing before me the
undersigned a Justice of the peace for the aforesaid County
and acknowledged the same to be his act and deed for
the purposes within mentioned and the negroes within
named to be manumitted according to the true intent
and meaning thereof and the act of Assembly in such
cases made and provided. A known legal before
