


in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and
 considerations and thereunto moving and in further
 consideration of the accidental omission of a clause
 of manumission for certain Negroes intended to be free
 in a bill of sale from me to Richard Luffington
 bearing date the 6th April 1837 I release from slavery
 liberate manumit and set free, and by this present do
 hereby release from slavery liberate manumit and
 set free the following Negroes when they shall respectively
 arrive at the age of thirty five years, namely Peggy
 woman Cole and her sons Tom and Jerry and her
 daughter Maria Jane, Negro woman Rachel, boy
 Bill, Henry, Andrew and girl Ellen as also Negroes
 Susan, Eliza, Sam and Ned which said Negroes and
 to serve sexually and individually until they arrive
 at the age of thirty five years and then I do declare them
 to be free manumitted and discharged from all manner
 of servitude or service to me my Executors or Administrators
 forever In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand and affixed my seal this 7th July 1837

On the back of the foregoing was thus written and
 signed and sealed by me this 7th July 1837
 personally appeared Lydia Gambull first to the
 within instrument of writing before me the undersigned
 a Justice of the peace of the State of Maryland for
 said County and acknowledged the same to be her
 act and deed for the purposes within mentioned and
 the Negroes within named to be their full manumitted
 and discharged from all services to her or to any
 claiming under her and to be free and manumitted
