 henceforth manumitted and discharged from all
 services to him or to any person claiming under
 him and to be free and manumitted according to
 the act of assembly in such cases made and

To all whom it may concern Best known that
 we Mary Aringer and Richard G. Shullon administrators
 of John Aringer deceased of Anne Arundel County
 in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and
 considerations as therunto moving as also in further
 consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars
 current money to us in hand paid have released
 from slavery liberated manumitted and set free
 and by these presents do hereby release from slavery
 liberated manumitted and set free our negro woman
 named Abigail being able to work and give
 a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and
 let the said negro woman named Abigail she do
 declare to be henceforth free manumitted and discharged
 from all manner of service or service to us our
 Executors or administrators for ever In Testimony
