 considerations and thoughts moving, as also in further
 consideration of the sum of one dollar current money to
 me or him paid have released from slavery liberated
 manumitted and set free by these presents do hereby
 release from slavery liberate manumit and set free
 my Negro woman named Sarah Lane being of the age
 of twenty nine years and able to work and gain a
 sufficient livelihood and maintenance and her the said
 Negro woman named Sarah Lane I do declare to be
 henceforth free manumitted and discharged, from all
 manner of servitude or service to me my Executors or
 administrators forever In Testimony whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this nineteenth
 day of June in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred
 and thirty nine

And Anne Arundel County Court: On this nineteenth day of
 June personally appeared Thomas Emory Sutter he being
 personally known to me partly to the within instrument of
 writing before me the Subscribing a Justice of the peace of the
 State of Maryland for the said County and acknowledges
 the same to be his act and deed for the purposes within
 mentioned, and the Negro woman within named to be
 henceforth manumitted and discharged from all
 services to him or to any claiming under him
 and to be free and manumitted according to the
 act,
