Know all persons by these presents that I George  
Stinchcomb of Anne Arundel County State of  
Maryland for cause good causes and considerations me  
thereunto moving have and by these presents do  
manumit liberate and discharge from bondage and  
slavery certain mulatto woman named Wager  
born aged about forty two years hereby declaring her  
from henceforward to be absolutely free and discharged  
from all manner of <sup>or service</sup> tribute to me or any other person  
or persons whatsoever. Given under my hand and  
seal this twenty first day of January Eighteen hundred  
and Eighteen.
