This Indenture Witnesseth that I Charles Stull
 Sheriff of Ann Arundel County in the State of Maryland
 for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to me in
 hand paid at and before the enrolling and delivery of
 these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 have released from Slavery manumitted and set free
 and by these presents do release from Slavery manumitted
 and set free my negro maid named Davy Brown
 being under forty five years of age of a healthy
 constitution sound in mind and body and capable
 by labour to procure to him sufficient food and
 raiment with other requisite necessaries of life. In
 Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 I seal this 21st day of March in the year of our Lord
 Eighteen hundred & eighteen
