To all whom it may concern. Be it known that
I George Watts of Anne Arundel County in the State of
Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations me
thereunto moving, as also in further consideration of
one Cent (and money to me in hand paid have)
received from Slavery liberated manumitted and set
free and by these presents do hereby release from
Slavery liberate manumitted and set free my Negro
woman Ann Docking being of the age of Forty three
years, and able to work and give a sufficient livelihood
and maintenance, and her the said Negro woman
named Ann Docking I do declare to be henceforth
free,
