


Bred at and before the delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge and for divers other considerations and causes me therunto moving, have released from slavery liberated manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby release from slavery liberate manumit and set free my mulatto woman named Albany Land being of the age of thirty seven years and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and let the said mulatto woman named Albany Land, I do declare to be hereafter free manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitude to me my executors or administrators forever In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of January in the year of our Lord eight hundred and fifty five
