Deed of Manumission from Elizabeth Harwood to Harriett Johnson dated the second day of April 1845

Know all men by these presents that I Elizabeth Harwood of Annapolis in

the State of Maryland for divers good causes and in consideration of the services rendered unto me by my negro woman Harriett Johnson (alias Morrey) have released from slavery liberated manumitted and set free my negro woman Harriett being of the age of 40 years and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and the same Harriett Morrey I do declare to be henceforth free manumitted and discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me my executors or administrators forever.

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this second day of April in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty five.
