intended to be manumitted and Set free by said deed
was omitted therefrom, and for the purpose of securing
to her her freedom this Instrument of writing is executed

Now therefore I Thomas Barley of Anne Arundel
County and State of Maryland do hereby Manumit
and Set free my Mulatto Slave Mary Ellen Smith born
on the 8 March 1842 her freedom to commence from the date
of these presents. Witness my hand and Seal this 28 day
of February eighteen hundred and sixty six,
