Deed of Manumission from  
Daniel C. Boston

Harriet Ennis

To all whom it may concern, be it known, that I, Daniel C. Boston of Anne Arundel County, in the State of Maryland,

for divers good causes and considerations, me, thereunto moving, have released from slavery, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit, and set free, my negro woman named Harriet Ennis, being of the age of twenty four years, and able to work, and gain a sufficient livelihood, and maintenance, and her the said negro woman Harriet Ennis, I do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitude to me, my Executors or Administrators forever. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty fifth day of April eighteen hundred
