To all whom it may concern, be it known, that I, Robt Birchhead of Anne Arundel County, in the State of Maryland,

for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving, do release from slavery, liberate, manumit, and set free, my negro boy John Prof, when he shall arrive at thirty five years of age; said boy was born, August 16th 1841; he is to serve my wife during her life, and after her death, to serve the residue of his time, equally divided among my heirs; should he not leave the state after the expiration of his servitude, I appoint my son, William H. Birchhead to act as his agent; that is, to see that he is kept among my heirs, treated well and compensated for his labor, and him the
