Be it remembered that on this fourth day of October in the year eighteen hundred and forty four before me the subscriber a justice of the peace of the said State in and for Anne Arundel County aforesaid personally appears the above named Joseph G. Harrison of the said County and acknowledges the same to be his act and deed for the purposes therein mentioned and the negroes within named and described to be henceforth manumitted and discharged from all services to him or any one claiming under him and to be free and manumitted according to the Acts of Assembly in such cases made and provided.

To all whom it may concern be it known that we Caspar Morris and Anne Morris of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations us thereto moving have released from Slavery liberated manumitted and set free and do by these presents hereby liberate manumit and set free our negro men William Smith Richard Neal John Davis Ned Plunson Daniel Davis and our negro woman Julia Hobbs being all under the age of 40 years and able to work and gain a livelihood and maintenance And them the said negroes named William Smith Richard Neal John Davis Ned Plunson Daniel Davis and Julia Hobbs we do declare to be henceforth free manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitude to us our Executor or administrators forever. In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands & seals this sixth day of August in the Year of our Lord 1844
