On this first day of January 1849, before the subscriber a Justice of the peace for Anne Arundel County, State of Maryland, personally appeared Thomas Davidson, and acknowledged the foregoing deed or emancipation to be his free act and deed, and the negro woman and child therein named, to be henceforth free, manumitted, and discharged from all persons and claims whatever.

Hazel Haynes to Rhoda Haynes {Stamp one dollar} To all whom it may concern, be it known, that I, Hazel Haynes of Anne Arundel County, in the state of Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do release from slavery, liberate, manumit, and set free my wife named Rhoda Haynes, aged about forty four, whom I purchased of G^{nt} Benjamin Clark Sen of the County and State aforesaid
