Deed of Manumission from
 Peryin H. Snowden
 to
 Tom Bacon

To all whom it
 may concern, be it
 known, that I, Peryin
 H. Snowden of Anne
 Arundel County,

in the state of Maryland, for divers good causes and
 considerations me thereunto moving, have
 released from slavery, liberated, manumitted
 and set free, and by these presents, do release from
 slavery, liberate, manumit, and set free, my
 negro man named Tom Bacon, being of the
 age of forty ^{two} years, and being able to work, and
 gain a sufficient livelihood and mainte-
 nance, to be henceforth free, manumitted and
 discharged from all manner of service or
 servitude to me, my Executors or Administra-
 tors forever. In witness whereof, I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this twenty second day
 of July, eighteen hundred and fifty.
