To all whom it may  
 concern, be it known  
 that I, James Cheston  
 of Anne Arundel  
 County, and John

Amique of Calvert County, in the State of Maryland  
 for divers good causes, and considerations  
 as thereto moving, have released from slavery,  
 liberated, manumitted and set free, and by  
 these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate,  
 manumit, and set free our negro man Lewis  
 Parker, being about forty years of age, and able  
 to work and gain a sufficient livelihood  
 and maintenance, and him the said Lewis  
 Parker, we do declare to be benefitee free, manumitted  
 and discharged from all manner of service  
 or servitude, to us, our executors, administrators,
