

have released from Slavery liberated manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby liberate manumit and set free my negro boy Thomas Mathews to take effect on Jan^{ry} 1st 1846 also my negro boy Niny Whitson to take effect on Jan^{ry} 1st 1850 also my negro boy William Bias to take effect on Jan^{ry} 1st 1861 also my negro boy John H. Smith to take effect on Jan^{ry} 1st 1862 also my negro Girl Sophy Davis to take effect Jan^{ry} 1st 1856 also my negro Girl Ellen Hobbs, to take effect Jan^{ry} 1st 1858 at which dates they will all be of age and able to work and gain a livelihood and maintenance and then the said negroes I do declare to be free manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitude to me my Executors or administrators from and after the dates above mentioned, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30 day of December in the year of our Lord 1844
