 the Sum of Three hundred and sixty nine pounds of Tobacco & by the
 app^l p^l about his Debt in this behalf expended and by the Court here

Philimon Hensley Commanded it was to the Sheriff of Kent
 County the nineteenth day of June in the
 fourth Year of his Lord Kings Dominion
 Robert Cary that he take Robert Cary of Kent County, Kent
 as did Robert Cary of Queen Anne County, Kent if he should be
 found in your Bailiwick & him safe keep so that he have his Body
 before us Justices of our next County Court to be held at our Court house
 in the Town of Newes in said County to Answer unto Philimon
 Hensley of a plea that he render him the full and just Summe of
 four hundred and one pounds of good Sound Merchantable Tobacco
 in Casque of the value of four pounds Sterling money which from
 him
