nor parcell thereof and that the a<sup>p</sup> Five pounds Seventeen Shillings  
is fully due. And the a<sup>p</sup> p<sup>t</sup> by Thomas Boone his attly prays  
Judgment for an Attachment it appearing to the Court that the a<sup>p</sup> note  
representing the true cause of a<sup>p</sup> was left according to Act of Assembly  
in such case made and the a<sup>p</sup> of said County declares that the a<sup>p</sup> note  
was left &c. Therefore it is ORDERED by the Court here by this  
Twenty first day of August Anno Domini One Thousand Seven hundred  
and Eighteen that the a<sup>p</sup> p<sup>t</sup> Nathaniel Hyson for the a<sup>p</sup> Summe  
of Five pounds Seventeen Shillings Current money Damages as also  
the Summe of Two hundred and Twenty Six pounds of Tobacco Cost by  
the a<sup>p</sup> p<sup>t</sup> about his Sute in this behalfe Card out And that the a<sup>p</sup> p<sup>t</sup>  
have an Attachment against the Goods and Chattels Rights and  
Credits of the a<sup>p</sup> Charles Johnson for the Summe a<sup>p</sup> according to  
Act of Assembly in such case made &c.

His Lord Shipt Laughton *Commanded it was to the Sheriff of Kent County the nine  
thirtieth day of June in the fourth year of his Lordships  
Dominion &c. that he take Christopher Bateman  
of Kent County Taylor if he should be found in his Bar:

his said Lord this Justices of the next Court to be held at our Court house in the Town of  
Chester in his County to answer unto the R<sup>ty</sup> Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Baron of Baltimore

for the said Proprietary as for himselfe prosecuteth against the said Christopher  
Bateman of a<sup>p</sup> that he rendered unto the said Lord Proprietary and the said  
Laughton the Summe of five hundred pounds of Tobacco of the value of seventy p<sup>d</sup> per lb  
from the said a<sup>p</sup> prop. and that the said Laughton be justly delam<sup>d</sup> &c. And that  
he have them and there the said writ &c. . . . . Att which said was Court  
by the nineteenth day of August the same year last mentioned the day of  
return of said writ unto Simon Wilmer Gent Just<sup>ty</sup> of said County and  
made return thereof in these words thereon Indaged as fol<sup>w</sup> by Capt  
Corpus & S. Wilmer Shipt*
