That William Woodland late Servt on ten hundred in the County of
William Woodland Labourer the first day of March in the year of our Lord one
Thousand Seven Hundred & Fourteen at St. Pauls Parish in the County afo^r & within the Jurisdiction
of this Court being by virtue of a certain Indenture then & now in force before a certain Orphan
Boy named James Dury to keep & maintain the said Orphan boy after the manner of
an apprenticeship from the date in the Indenture specified above mentioned & to work till the said Orphan
should arrive to the age of twenty one years in which said Servt & Spouse last
mentioned the said William the said Orphan boy should teach or procure to be
taught in the art or Mystery of a Carpenter as also to learn to write a legible
hand & to teach Aretimotick as farre as the rule of three & should keep the afo^r
Orphan boy to trade afo^r during the said term or space in the said Indenture
mentioned for the time afo^r service and not to turn or oblige the said Orphan boy
to work or labour at any other Employment than in the said Indenture mentioned
& yet the said William Woodland the said Orphan boy hath not taught his
trade nor kept him to write nor taught him Aretimotick but at St. Pauls
Parish in the County afo^r & within the Jurisdiction of this Court hath turned &
kept the said Orphan boy to other work & Labour then mentioned in the said
Indenture to great damage of the said James Dury against the peace of the
said Lord Prop^r His Rule & Dignity & against an Act of Assembly of this province
now in force in such case made & provided by Mr. Johnson & Dno. Appr^r.
