Sabourer the first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & fourteen at St. Pauls parish in the County of & within the jurisdiction of this Court being by virtue of a certain indenture then & now in force & effect of a certain Orphan Boy named James Duerly to keep & maintain the said orphan boy after the manner of an apprentice from the date in the said indenture specified & above mentioned & until the said orphan should arrive to the age of twenty one years in which said term & space last mentioned the said William the said Orphan boy should teach or procure to be taught in the art or Mystery of a Carpenter as also to learn to write a legible hand & to teach Arithmetick as far as the rule of three & should keep the said orphan boy to y<sup>e</sup> trade ap. for & during the said term or space in the said indenture mentioned for the time of servitude and not to turn or oblige the said orphan boy to work or labour at any other Employment then in the said indenture mentioned Yet the said William Woodland the said Orphan boy hath not taught his trade nor kept him to write nor taught him Arithmetick but at St. Pauls parish in the County of & within the jurisdiction of this Court hath turned & kept y<sup>e</sup> said Orphan boy to other work & labour then mentioned in the said indenture to y<sup>e</sup> great damage of the said James Duerly against the peace of our said Lord propy. this Rule Rightly & against an Act of Assembly of this province now in force in such Case made & provided at Johnson of Dno of Court
