Henry Seven Years Service and her time of Service to her afo^r Master being expired and she being in Court And M^r. William Frisby also the Court offers her to him for the time afo^r for the Sum of Eighteen hundred pounds of Tobacco the which he accepts and assumes to pay to this County the Sum of Eighteen hundred pounds of Tobacco to be paid the ensuing Year for the afo^r Mary Chambers Service and the afo^r Mary Chambers to serve the afo^r M^r. William Frisby the Seven Years Service as afo^r

The Lord pro^{ps} the afo^r Thomas Cooke at last Court being committed into the Custody of the Sheriff of said County for his afo^r to this Court the afo^r Thomas Cooke in his proper person appears in Court ordered by the Court that the afo^r Thomas be therefrom discharged

The afo^r Thomas Cooke being committed as afo^r and that he was to appear at the Court to answer unto a certain Bill of an Indictment found against him for feloniously taking from a certain Robert Lynch of the goods and Chattels of a certain William Pope This Court here discharges the said Thomas Cooke from the said Commitment

Timothy Staute an Lord agst some comes into Court and in his proper person appears to the same ordered by the Court here that he be discharged from his Recognizance

Timothy Staute being bound in Recognizance at last Court as an Lord on his Lord Ships behalfe agst the afo^r Thomas Cooke in the Sum of two pounds Sterling to be levied &c. Conditionally that if he did not appear at this Court to give his Evidence And now at this Court the Court here discharges him from his said Recognizance

Thomas Hughes Entered into Recognizance as an Lord agst the same comes into Court and in his proper person appears to same ordered by the Court here that he be discharged from his Recognizance as also his Surety Hugh for his appearance be discharged

Thomas Hughes afo^r being bound in Recognizance at last Court as an Evidence on his Lord Ships behalfe against the afo^r Thomas Cooke in the Sum of two pounds Sterling to be levied &c. Conditionally that if he did not appear at this Court to give his Evidence as afo^r This Court here discharges him from the same Recognizance
