the publick whipping post and there to receive as in the Judgment afo and then to be brought into Court.

after which the same day last mentioned came the said Sheriff and made return of his said precept in these words thereon endorsed as folo viz. in all things served and executed as Simon Williams the ordered that William Brown Master of the afo James Dill prove if he was his Serv. at the time of begetting the afo Child on which the afo Brown having taken his oath on the Holy Evangelists saith that the afo James Dill was his Serv. Some time in August 1717 until some time in November following in which the afo Child was begott.

prays an allowance for trouble charge Suing for and for time and disgrace of the house ordered that as it appears the Begitter was a Servant that the afo Dill serve at the expiration of her time of service to her then Master two months it being the half of what is thought sufficient.

ordered to be delivered at the expiration of her time ordered by the Court here that there be allowed to Peter Green in the saying the Levy this Court four hundred pounds of Tobacco for the keeping the afo Child to this time

ordered by the Court here that there be allowed to Peter Green in the saying the Levy at November Court next the same of Ninety pounds of Tobacco for the ensuing year for the keeping the afo Child of which live otherwise Equivalent

James Dill

His Lordship - Judgment for committing fornication with Elizabeth Lock. to wit. he being called came and in his proper person James Dill Serv appeared and pleads not guilty &c. and he who prosecutes to Wm Brown for the afo prof says he is guilty &c. ordered by the Court here that the same enter into Recognizance for his appearance to next Court to answer the same and in the meantime to be of good Behaviour

James Dill afo acknowledges himself indebted to his Lordship his heirs & Successors in the sum of fifteen pounds Sterling to be levied on his goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if he do not make his personall appearance at the next Court to be held for said County to answer unto a certain Judgment found against him for committing fornication with a certain Elizabeth Lock and in the mean time to be of good Behaviour wherewith he acknowledges himself content

William Brown of said County comes into Court and acknowledges himself indebted to his Lordship his heirs and Successors in the sum of fifteen pounds Sterling to be levied on his goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the afo James Dill shall not appear
