Commanced it was to the Sheriff of Kent
County the Twenty first day of March in the
third Year of his Lord Shups Dominion that
he take William Frisby of Kent County Gentleman

Administrator of the goods and Chattells which were of Maurice Daviss late of
Caull County Taylor Deceased at the time of his death who dyed Intestate as it
said also did Morris Davis of Caull County not administered by Sarah Daviss
deceased relict and Administratrix of all and Singular the Goods and Chattells
which were of the afo^r Maurice Davis if he should be found in his Bailynk
and him safe keep so that he have his body before his said Lord Shups
Justices of the peace for said County at a Court to be held for said County at the
Court house in the Town of Chester in said County do answer unto Matthias
Vanderhuyden of a plea that he render him the Summe of four and twenty
Thousand two hundred twenty pounds of good Sound Merchentable Bright
Tobacco and Cash to contain the same of the value of Seventy five pounds
Sterling money which from him he unjustly detains &c And that he have
then and there the said writ &c

At which said next Court by the Seventeenth day of June Anno Domini
one Thousand Seven hundred and Eighteen the day of return of said writ came
Simon Wilmer Gent. High Sheriff of said County and made return thereof in these
words thereon endorsed as folo^w viz. Cepi Corpus p^r Simon Wilmer

and a Declaration being filed when said writ issued forth and a copy thereof
served therewith according to the Act of Assembly in such case made was as folo^w.
viz. Kent County's William Frisby of Kent County Gentleman Administrator of the
goods and Chattells which were of Maurice Daviss late of Caull County Taylor Deceased
at the time of his death who dyed Intestate as it said also did Morris Davis
of Caull County not administered by Sarah Daviss deceased relict and Admini:
tratrix of all and Singular the goods and Chattells which were of the afo^r.

Maurice Davis was summoned to answer unto Matthias Vanderhuyden
of a plea that he render him the Summe of four and twenty thousand two
hundred twenty pounds of good Sound Merchentable Bright Tobacco and Cash to
contain the same of the value of Seventy five pounds Sterling money which from
him he unjustly detains &c And whereupon the afo^r p^r Michael

Howard his atty saith that whereas the afo^r Maurice in his lifetime the six
day of April in the Year of our Lord Christ one Thousand Seven hundred and
thirteen did paye p^r him in Kent County within the Jurisdiction of this Court
by his certain writing obligatory which he the said Maurice in his lifetime

sealed with his Seal and as his due delivered hereinto Court brought the
date whereof is the same day and Year of Granted himselfe p^rden and family
bound unto the afo^r p^r in the afo^r Summe of four and twenty thousand two
hundred twenty pounds of good Sound Merchentable Bright Tobacco and
Cash to contain the same of the afo^r value of Seventy five pounds Sterling money
to be paid unto the afo^r p^r when thereunto required yet the afo^r Maurice in
his lifetime and the afo^r Sarah in her lifetime after the death of the afo^r
Maurice
