and the afo Am Kennard in her proper person appeared to the afo Indictm. and the same being read as afo she saith that she cannot gain say but that she is guilty as afo and submits to the Court on the same therefore it is ordered by the Court here viz. this Nineteenth day of March Annoque Domini one thousand seven hundred and eighteen That the afo Am Kennard pay the sume of thirty Shillings current money her fine for committing the offence of fornication afo according to Law and also pay the sume of one hundred and eighty two pounds of Tobacco fees accruing on the premises afo

Ordered by the Court here that the afo Am Kennard prove the persons that committed the fornication afo with her the afo Am being sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God saith that William Debruler was the person that did begit the Case born Child she last bore for which she stands Inducted as afo

ordered by the Court here that there be allowed to the person where she was delivered the sume of four hundred pounds of Tob. for trouble and charge for bringing the afo Am to bed and in looking after her the time she lay in bed by the afo Am Kennard and William Debruler

On which William Debruler of said County was called who came and in his proper person appeared in Court and it is ordered by the Court here that the afo William as reputation father of the afo Child enter into Recognizance with good Sureties in the sume of forty pounds of Tob. of month while the Child may be burthenome to the County for the maintenance of the same

William Debruler afo comes into Court and Acknowledges himself Indebted to the afo Am Kennard in the sume of forty pounds of Tobacco to be paid to her every Month she keeps and maintains the afo Child until the afo Child may be no further burthenome to the County where with he Acknowledges himself Content

Benjamin Blackledge and Daniel Perkins both of this County Acknow- ledge themselves Indebted to the afo Am Kennard in the sume of twenty pounds of Tobacco each month to be paid to her every month she keeps and maintains the afo Child until the afo Child may be no further burthenome to the County if the afo William Debruler do not pay it himself or where with they Acknowledge themselves to be therewith Content

ordered by the Court here that the afo William Debruler enter into Recognizance for his appearance to next Court with Sureties

William Debruler afo comes into Court and Acknowledges himself Indebted to his Lord Ship his heirs and Successors in the sume of four pounds shillings
